

What to bring ...

It is best to label each item with the scholars' name, clearly and permanently. Students should come prepared for both rain and heat. Clothing should be comfortable and durable, most activities take place inside an air-conditioned environment (school wear is most appropriate).

BOYS - Please note that you are in Wickham Hall this year instead of Kinzer Family Residential Center, so you **will not** have refrigerators or microwaves in the room or in-suite bathrooms.

All over-the-counter and prescription medication must be registered and turned into program staff at check-in)

OPTIONAL EQUIPMENT

- One inexpensive telephone (per room) (2.8 GHz digital/cordless phones are not allowed)
- Sunscreen and bug spray are optional (some activities will be conducted outside)
- Camera and film
- Extra money
- Stationery or postcards, addressed and stamped for sending home (optional)
- Portable television (one television outlet per room)
- Radio (music with any profane language will not be acceptable - iPods with headphones preferred)
- Fan
- Refrigerator
- Iron
- Lockbox
- Cell phone (cell phones should be kept in a secure location and be powered off during class and activities)

DO NOT BRING

Pocket knives or firearms (This is illegal!)

Electrical appliances

Skates or skateboards

Alcoholic beverages or drugs of any kind (This will result in dismissal from the program.)

A note about appropriate attire/clothing:

Clothing worn during the summer program should be modest, appropriate for an academic setting (please refer to the scholar handbook) and meet the following guidelines:

1) TOPS must have sleeves, (any top with straps such as muscle shirts, tank tops and sundresses, will need to be modestly covered — broad straps of 3 inches or more will be permitted in summer outdoor activities) and completely cover the midriff and back. Shirts which button down the front must be buttoned modestly. See-through materials, under garments worn as outer garments and tightly fitting shirts are unacceptable.

2) PANTS and shorts must be worn at the waistline and shorts should be long enough to extend to the middle thigh.

3) Clothing advertising alcoholic beverages or tobacco **or displaying inappropriate** words, designs or comments should not be worn.

4) SHOES - casual, comfortable shoes in **good** repair, including athletic shoes.

(Scholars are expected to be well-groomed and neatly dressed during all activities. Scholars are expected to respect the spirit of the dress code, not simply the letter of the code. Scholars not in adherence to these standards will be asked to change the article of clothing or item in question.)

College Portfolio & Essay Course Materials (Rising Seniors)

Items that need to be collected and brought to campus with each scholar include as much of the following as possible:

- Your three-inch “viewable” **binder** from your Freshman year
- **25 sheet protectors (non-glare)**
- **Work samples** (Physical examples of your work. Projects, reports, documents, menus, brochures, musical scores, etc. Work samples are proof of your abilities in **a skill** or content area - there is no limit to **a number** you can include in your portfolio)
- **Updated (current) Letters of Recommendations** (or at least names and addresses of 3-5 people who would provide **a positive** college recommendation for you)
- **Certifications, Diplomas or Awards**
- **Community Service** (work samples, letters of recognition, photos of projects completed, programs and brochures relating to community service projects or certificates)
- **Memberships and Certificates** (membership cards, citations, and letters related to professional organizations — “Who’s Who,” National Beta Club, etc.)
- **Academic Plan of Study** — a list of courses that you have taken (especially Honors & AP) — transcripts, report cards, etc. and plan to take in college (possible major?)
